PASSAGE OF THIS INITIATIVE IS AN EXPRESSION OF THE OPINION OF THE VOTERS IN MONTANA AND WOULD HAVE NO LEGAL EFFECT.

INITIATIVE NO. 92
 THIS INITIATIVE WOULD EXPAND AUTHORIZED GAMBLING IN MONTANA AND CREATE A STATE GAMING COMMISSION. IT WOULD ALLOW BLACKJACK, PUNCHED CARDS, AND ELECTRONIC OR MECHANICAL GAMBLING DEVICES THAT SIMULATE CARD GAMES, BINGO OR KENO. BINGO AND KENO PAYOFFS COULD BE MADE IN CASH. THE STATE GAMING COMMISSION WOULD LICENSE AND REGULATE ALL AUTHORIZED GAMBLING IN MONTANA INCLUDING THE MANUFACTURE, SALE AND APPROVAL OF GAMBLING DEVICES. THE COMMISSION WOULD SET PRIZE LIMITS FOR ALL GAMES. LOCAL GOVERNMENTS COULD ASSESS FEES OR TAXES ON GAMBLING ESTABLISHMENTS, TABLES AND DEVICES. OPERATION OF A GAMBLING ESTABLISHMENT WITHOUT A LICENSE WOULD BE A FELONY.

INITIATIVE NO. 94
 THIS INITIATIVE WOULD ABOLISH THE QUOTA SYSTEM FOR SOME BEER AND WINE LICENSES. BUSINESSES WITH SUFFICIENT KITCHEN AND DINING ROOM EQUIPMENT TO SERVE MEALS TO THE PUBLIC COULD APPLY FOR A LICENSE TO SELL BEER AND WINE. THE AVAILABILITY OF THOSE LICENSES WOULD NOT BE BASED ON POPULATION. ESTABLISHMENTS HOLDING LICENSES UNDER THE PRESENT QUOTA SYSTEM WOULD BE ENTITLED TO A TRANSFERABLE CREDIT ON THEIR STATE TAXES FOR ANY LOSS IN THE FAIR MARKET VALUE OF THAT LICENSE.

INITIATIVE NO. 95
 UNDER THIS INITIATIVE THE STATE WOULD TAKE ONE-FOURTH (25%) OF ALL FUTURE DEPOSITS TO THE PERMANENT COAL TAX TRUST AND INVEST IT IN MONTANA'S ECONOMY. THE STATE WOULD MAKE NO DIRECT LOANS, BUT WOULD EMPHASIZE INVESTMENTS IN NEW OR EXPANDING ENTERPRISES.
 THE INITIATIVE WOULD ALSO CREATE AN ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT FUND, USING A PORTION OF THE INTEREST FROM THE COAL TAX TRUST. AFTER DETERMINING HOW MUCH INTEREST TO ALLOCATE TO THE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT FUND THE LEGISLATURE MAY SPEND MONEY FROM THE FUND TO SUPPORT ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT IN THE STATE.
