Should the qualified Gallatin County voters, who reside outside of the five incorporated municipalities of Gallatin County, authorize the County Commissioners to exceed the 1.5 mills limitation imposed by I-105 which are levied for public library services, by an additional levy of 3.5 mills annually upon all taxable property outside of the incorporated municipalities of Gallatin County to maintain public library services pursuant to Section 22-1-304, MCA?
