TOWN OF MANHATTAN BALLOT ISSUES That the Town Council of the Town of Manhattan be authorized, pursuant to Section 15-10-420, MCA, to levy an additional 20.24 mills on each dollar of taxable value of all taxable property within the Town of Manhattan, including newly taxable property, to adequately fund the volunteer fire department of the Town of Manhattan. Example: 20.24 additional mills would increase the annual property taxes on the average residential property in Manhattan by approximately \$42.50.
