CITY BALLOT ISSUE

Bozeman Levy

That the City Commission of the City of Bozeman, Montana, be authorized to exceed the statutory mill levy allowed by Section 15-10-420, M.C.A., by levying up to eight mills annually, for a period not to exceed three years, to fund capital projects for the Bozeman Fire Department. The specific amount of money that is to be raised, based on the City of Bozeman Fiscal Year 2002 mill rate, is \$334,000 annually. The levy shall be for three years. Approval of this additional mill levy will result in an annual increase of \$19.10 for a home with an assessed valuation of \$100,000, or an annual increase of \$38.20 for a home with an assessed valuation of \$200,000.

West Yellowstone Resort Tax Renewal

Whether the town council of West Yellowstone, Montana, in accordance with Section 7-6-1504 of the Montana Code Annotated, should be authorized to renew the town's 3% resort tax for an additional twenty years beginning January 1, 2006. The Town's 3% resort tax is now scheduled to expire on December 31, 2005. Approval of this ballot measure would authorize the town council to renew or extend the 3% resort tax for an additional twenty years, beginning on January 1, 2006 and ending on December 31, 2025.
