# PETITION FOR ROAD.

To the County Surveyor of Gallatin County, Montana:

The undersigned, your petitioners, citizens of the United States, respectfully show and represent that they are residents of Road District No. 2, in the County of Gallatin, State of Montana, where the road hereafter petitioned for, is to be located, laid out and established, if this petition be granted. That the proposed road will be a public convenience, and, we think, the public good requires it.

Your petitioners do respectfully ask and petition that a County road, sixty feet in width, to be a public highway, be laid out, located and established, and show:— (a) The general route of the proposed road; (b) over what lands it is proposed to be established; (c) who are the owners thereof; (d) whether such of them as can be found, consent thereto; (e) who of them do not consent; (f) the probable cost of the right-of-way where such consent is not had; (g) the necessity for and the advantages of the proposed road as follows, to-wit:

"A" Commencing at the quarter corner between Section 26 N, 17R3E, and 21 T14N40, thence running north 1/2 mile to the N.E. corner of Sec 26 1/2 3E, thence the route are proposed and it is proposed to have to the course which the county will accept as being to the best interests of all concerned. Cost of the proposed route continues due north, on Section and top line as near as practical, until it crosses the railroad and intersects with the Bogman and Manhattan road. Total length of road about 2 1/2 miles. The other proposed route beginning from N.E. corner of Section 26 1/2 3E, thence running East about 25 rods to S.E. corner of M. Kennedy's place thence north 1/2 mile thence west about 25 rods to East quarter corner of Sec. 25 2, 17, R3E, thence due north as near as practical until it crosses the R.R. and intersects with the Bogman Manhattan road.

"B" To land, W.W. Curtis, M. Kennedy, C.A. Holgate, Mrs. B. Curtis, Estate of J. Davis, "D" to land W.W. Curtis, Mrs. Curtis, "E" M. Kennedy, C.A. Holgate.

"C" M. Kennedy \$200.00 on the first proposed route and \$100.00 on the 2<sup>d</sup> proposed route.  
C.A. Holgate \$100.00

"D" It furnishes an outlet to W.W. Curtis, M. Kennedy, and Mrs. Curtis who at present have no county road adjoining their property. "2" It furnishes a railroad station to a large quantity of grain, making a saving of several miles of hauling on a trip. "3" There is at present no road to nearly 2 miles West of the West Gallatin where the proposed road is to run, and there is no way to get through except by opening gates and going through people's fields.

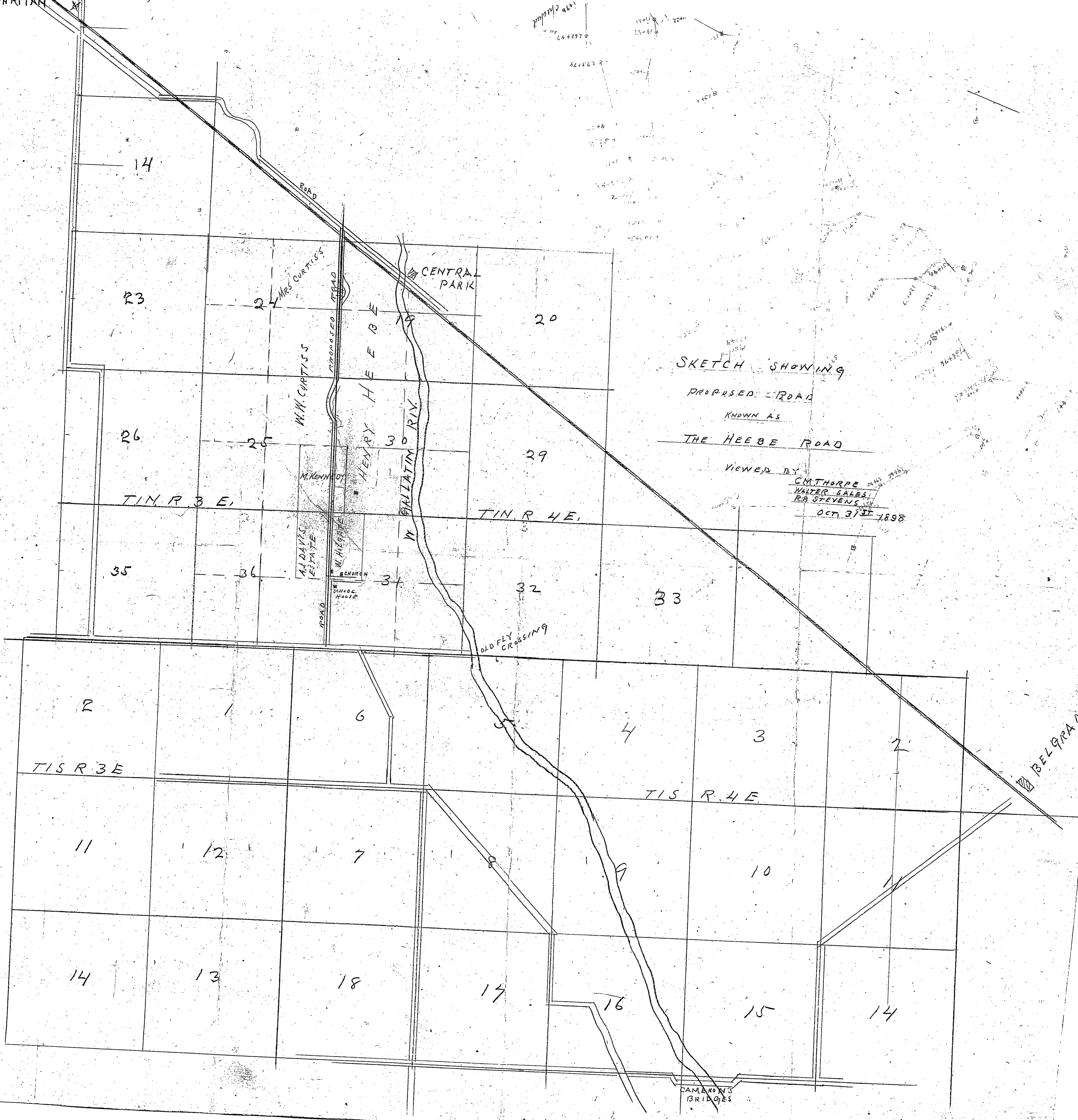

# REPORT OF ROAD VIEWERS.

To the Honorable, the Board of County Commissioners of Gallatin County:

WE, the undersigned Road Viewers, appointed by the <sup>Chairman of the</sup> Board of County Commissioners, <sup>and the Co. Surveyor</sup> ~~at the~~ <sup>together with said surveyor.</sup> Term of said Board to view a proposed road running from <sup>the 1/4 Sec. Cor. between</sup>

Sections 36 T. 1 N. R. 3 E. and 31 T. 1 N. R. 4 E.

to a point in the <sup>Bozeman and Manhattan road</sup> ~~Bozeman and Manhattan road~~ <sup>where the same is intersected</sup> ~~by the Township line~~ <sup>beginning north from the above described starting point</sup> ~~That on the~~ <sup>31<sup>st</sup></sup> day of <sup>Oct</sup>, 1898, we started from <sup>the</sup>

R. 4 E. thence north on the Township line as near as practicable to the intersection with the Bozeman & Manhattan road, north of the N.P. RR. track, the length of the proposed road is about 2 1/2 miles, Probable Cost, \$600.

2. The estimate of damages to the owner of any land over which it is proposed to run the highway, as follows:

WE believe that all land owners will be benefited fully equal to the damage.

3. The names of land owners who consent to give the right of way, and we hereto attach their written consent, as follows:

4. The names of land owners who do not consent and the amount of damages claimed by each, as follows:

M. Kennedy does not consent to allow the road to cross his land, although he has no outlet. W. Hulgate claims \$20.00 per acre which would amount to \$37.00

5. The following facts bearing upon the subject, which may be of importance to the Board:

The proposed road would provide an outlet for several ranches as stated in the petition. Also a saving of several miles in hauling grain to market for a large tract of country. The ground over which the proposed road passes is level and as good as could be got for a road in that locality. We would recommend that if established the road be surveyed & platted. We believe said road to be practicable and of public utility and

necessity and do recommend the establishment of the same.

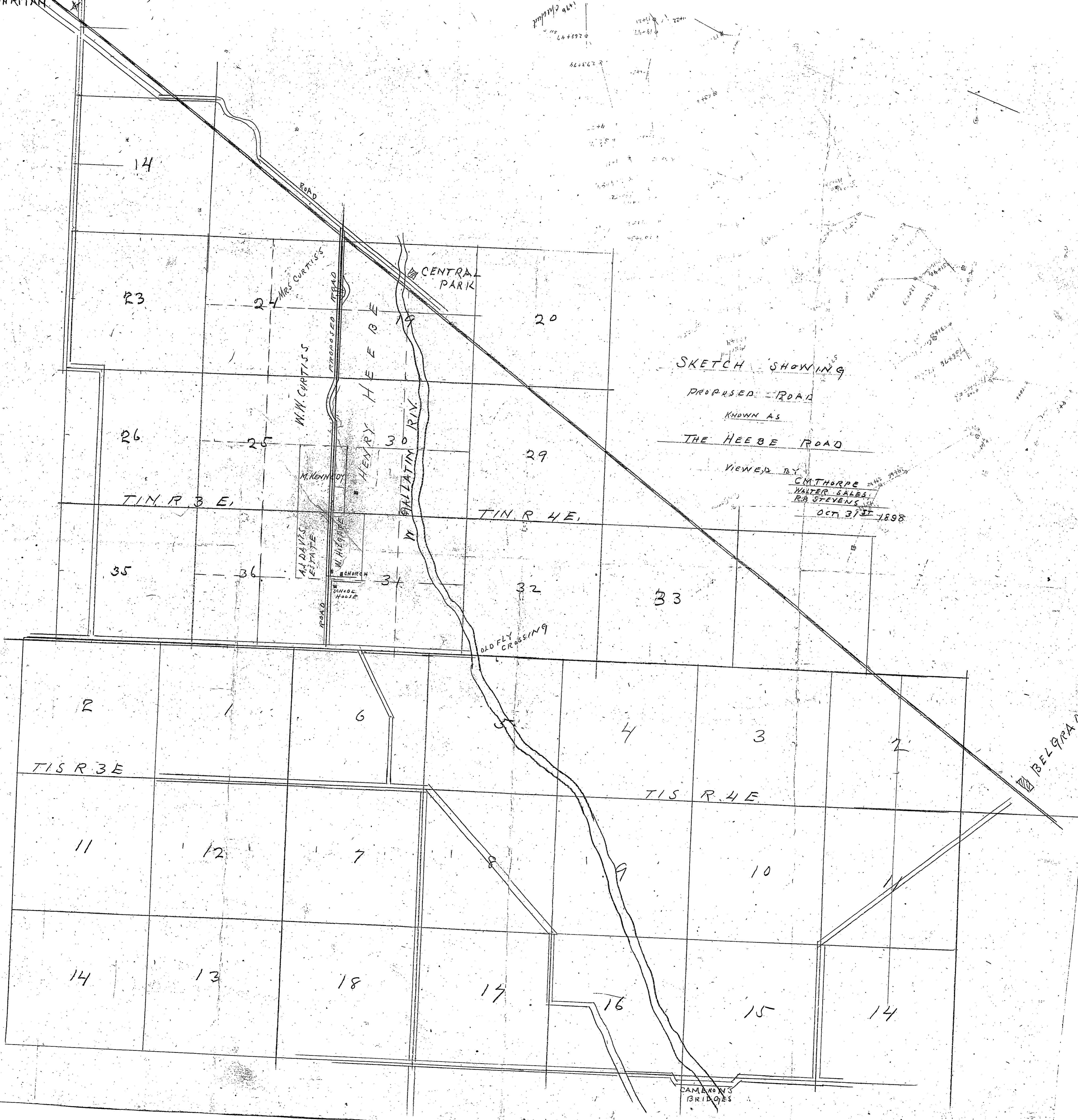
