To the County Surveyor of Gallatin County, Montana:

The Undersigned, your petitioners, citizens of the United States, respectfully show and represent that they are residents of Road District No. 4, in the County of Gallatin, State of Montana, where the road hereafter petitioned for, is to be located, laid out and established, if this petition be granted. That the proposed road will be a public convenience, and, we think, the public good requires it.

Your petitioners do respectfully ask and petition that a County road, sixty feet in width, to be a public highway, be laid out, located and established, and show:— (a) The general route of the proposed road; (b) over what lands it is proposed to be established; (c) who are the owners thereof; (d) whether such of them as can be found, consent thereto; (e) who of them do not consent; (f) the probable cost of the right-of-way where such consent is not had; (g) the necessity for and the advantages of the proposed road as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at the corner to sections 11, 12, 13 and 14 Township 2 South Range 4 East thence easterly to a point in the east line of the Northwest quarter of section 13 said township and range, said point being thirty feet south of the Northeast corner of said Northwest quarter of said section 13 T. 2 south R. 4. REPORT OF ROAD VIEWERS.

ROAD NO. 163

TO THE HONORABLE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF GALLATIN COUNTY, MONTANA:

We, the undersigned Road Viewers, consisting of E. Broox Martin who was appointed by the County Surveyor R. H. Ferguson who was appointed by the Chairman of the Board of County Commissioners, and C. M. Hoop County Surveyor appointed to view a proposed road running from the corner to Sections 11, 12, 13, & 14 T. 2 S. R. 4 E. to a point in the east line of the NW 1/4 of Sec. 13 to said T. & R. said point being 30 feet south of the N.E. Cor. of said as described in the annexed petition, say, That on the 22nd day of July A. ARTICLES OF AGREEMENT, Made and entered into this ...8th... day of ... March A. D. 1901, by and between Henry Monforton of Bozeman Mont. party of the first part, and the County of Gallatin State of Mont. by its Board of County Commissioners, the party of the second part;

WITNESSETH, That if the party of the second part, shall first make the payments and perform the covenants hereinafter mentioned on its part to be performed, the said party of the first part hereby covenants and agrees to convey to the said party of the second part by a Quitclaim Deed a strip of land 60 feet in width to be used as a right of way for a county road, the center line of said right of way is described as follows to-wit:

Beginning at the corner to sections 11, 12, 13, and 14, T. 2S. R. 4 E., thence easterly to a point in the east line of the N. W. 1/4 of section 13 said township and range, said point being 30 feet south of the N. E. Corner of said N.W. 1/4 of said

and also to allow said second party to construct a road way upon said right of way twice the width of said right of way

And the said party of the second part, hereby covenant and agrees to pay to the said party of the first part the sum of seven hundred (700.00) dollars, Also to vacate and discontinue the county road on the east and south sides of the N. 1/2 of the N.W. 1/4 of Section 13, T. 2 S. R. 4 E. whenever the above described right of way shall be opened for travel.

Also to construct a substantial passageway for stock and teams to pass underneath the proposed roadway. And further to construct all necessary culverts and ditches for the purpose of conducting water across the said right of way for the irrigation of the land now owned by the said party of the first part.

IT IS MUTUALLY AGREED, By and between the parties hereto, that all the covenants and agreements, herein contained shall extend to and be obligatory upon the heirs, executors, administrators and assigns and successors, of the respective parties.

Said right of way that to be opened for travel shall be twice the width of said right of way. The Board of County Commissioners shall execute all agreements.
