To the ~~County Surveyor~~ of Gallatin County, Montana:

The **Undersigned**, your petitioners, citizens of the United States, respectfully show and represent that they are residents of Road District No. 5, in the County of Gallatin, State of Montana, where the road hereafter petitioned for, is to be located, laid out and established, if this petition be granted. That the proposed road will be a public convenience, and, we think, the public good requires it.

Your petitioners do respectfully ask and petition that a County road, sixty feet in width, to be a public highway, be laid out, located and established, and show:— (a) The general route of the proposed road; (b) over what lands it is proposed to be established; (c) who are the owners thereof; (d) whether such of them as can be found, consent thereto; (e) who of them do not consent; (f) the probable cost of the right-of-way where such consent is not had; (g) the necessity for and the advantages of the proposed road as follows, to-wit:

a. Beginning at a point in the center of the Road one half mile South of the Northwest quarter of Section Eighteen (18) in Township One (1) South of Range Six (6) East, thence due South on section lines to a point in the Northwest quarter of Section Thirty (30) Township One (1) South of Range Six (6) East, where the said section line intersects with the old established "Luce" road.

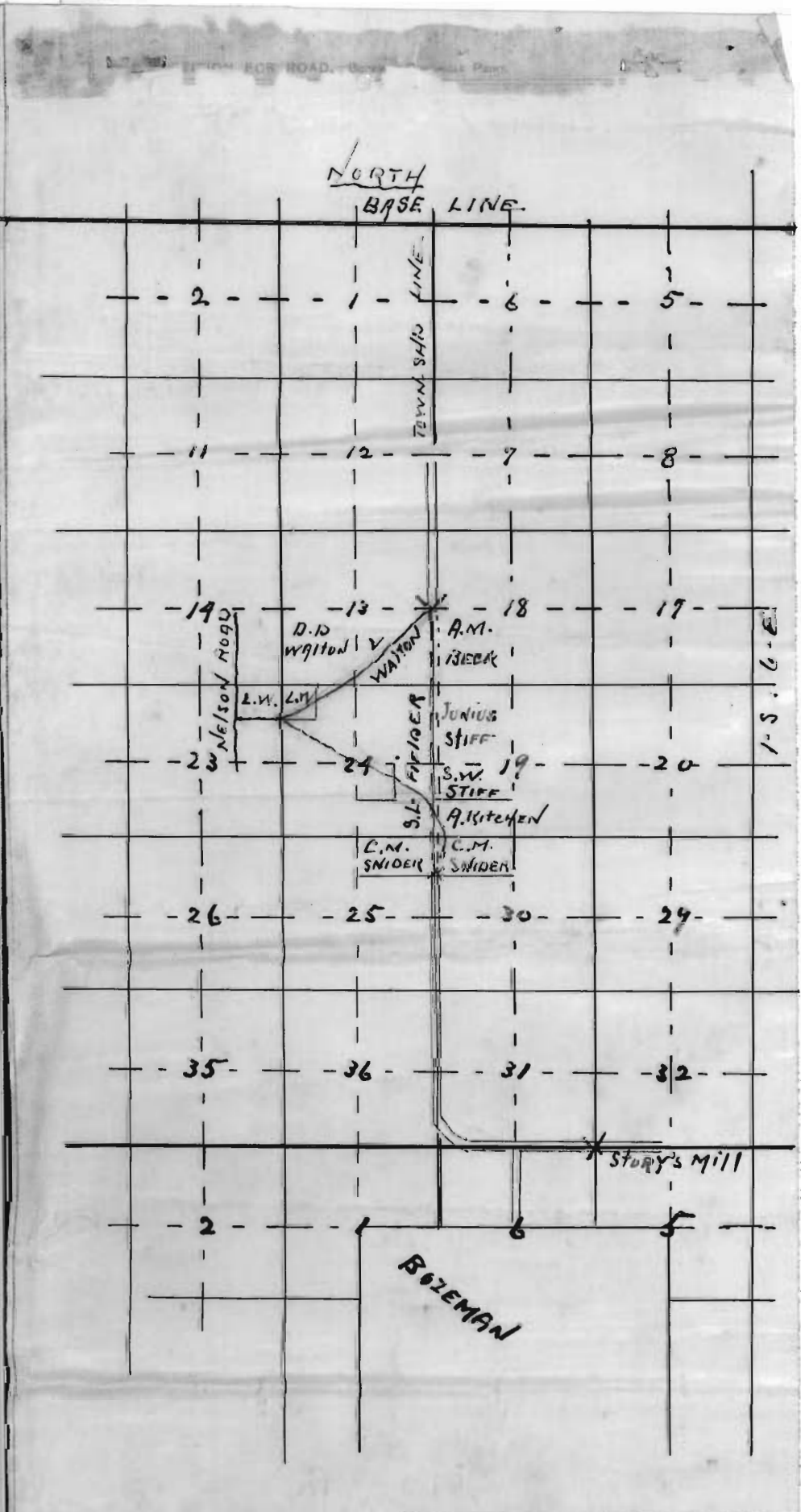

We, the undersigned Road Viewers, consisting of A. L. Corbly, G. A. Shay
and E. H. Schumacher substitute for Mr. C. M. Thorpe

appointed to view a proposed road running from Northwest corner of South west
quartr of Section 18, T. 1 S. R. 6 E.
to North West quarter of Northwest quarter of Sec. 30, T. 1 S. R. 6 E.
as described in the annexed petition, say, That on the 3rd day of April
A. D., 1900 we assembled at the place designated in the petition, as the starting point of such proposed
road and proceeded to view the same, and submit the following report:

1. The width of the proposed road, the description of the center line of the same, the length, how
defined, the marks and sources, grades, character of ground, description of the land and owners of the
same, over which the proposed road passes, and probable cost of constructing the said road, as follows:

The width of the proposed road is to be 60 feet, the
length of the same is 9921 feet, marked by stakes
and blazes on fence posts, the ground is of such a
character that by making cuts and filling in the
hollows same can be made a good road, the
ground for the same will make a good road bed,
Most the ground the road will traverse is farm land,
A. M. Beck owns the SW¹/₄ of Sec. 18, T. 1 S. R. 6 E.
L. Walton owns the SE¹/₄ of Sec. 13, T. 1 S. R. 5 E.

4. The estimate of damages in excess of benefits to the owner of any land over which it is proposed to run the highway, as follows:

Along Beck's benefits are in the opinion of the viewers equal to the damages
L. Walton's claim of \$200.00 in the opinion of the viewers is excessive and the
Board of viewers think that \$100.00 would amply pay for the damages.
A. L. Fielder's claim of \$200.00 is in the opinion of the viewers same as Mr. Walton's
Mrs Anna Lipsy's claim of \$500.00 is excessive and \$250.00 should be ample
to repay him. June Stiff's damages are equal to benefits. P. W. Stiff's
benefits are equal to damages, G. M. Snyder's damages are estimated to the amount of \$750.00

5. The following facts, bearing upon the subject, which may be of importance to the Board:

This Road to the viewers appears to be a necessity to the
people living north of the starting point of the proposed
road, shortening the distance very materially to the
Mills and Market at Rozeman and would undoubtedly
