PETITION FOR ROAD.

Hon. Board of County Commissioners
 To the County Surveyor of Gallatin County, Montana:

The Undersigned, your petitioners, citizens of the United States, respectfully show and represent that they are residents of Road District No. 0, in the County of Gallatin, State of Montana, where the road hereafter petitioned for, is to be located, laid out and established, if this petition be granted. That the proposed road will be a public convenience, and, we think, the public good requires it.

Your petitioners do respectfully ask and petition that a County road, sixty feet in width, to be a public highway, be laid out, located and established, and show:— (a) The general route of the proposed road; (b) over what lands it is proposed to be established; (c) who are the owners thereof; (d) whether such of them as can be found, consent thereto; (e) who of them do not consent; (f) the probable cost of the right-of-way where such consent is not had; (g) the necessity for and the advantages of the proposed road as follows, to-wit:

Starting on the Town Ship line & at quarter Rock between Section 18, owned by J. B. Morgan no damage. ^{T.3N. R.3E} and 13, owned by Mrs Jennie Kamp damage not known. ^{T.3N. R.4E}
 And following line North 1/4 mi to corner of Section 12, ^{T.3N. R.4E} & 7, ^{T.3N. R.5E} then a North Easterly course through Sec 7, owned by Mrs Jennie Kamp damage unknown striking Sec line about one quarter ^{mi} East of Town Ship line. Then running a North Easterly direction through Sec 6, ^{T.3N. R.5E} owned by Thom C. Dudley & John C. No damage striking the quarter Rock on North line (then plunging South on line between Pitman and Jordan through unsurveyed land) then running North 1 mile ^{on line} through unsurveyed land owned by Dudley Pitman, C. Jordan Sam Duncan Frank Wood No Damage. Intersecting with Jordan Road at quarter Rock

REPORT OF ROAD VIEWERS.

ROAD NO. 176

TO THE HONORABLE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF GALLATIN COUNTY, MONTANA:

We, the undersigned Road Viewers, consisting of D. H. Pitman, B. S. Duncan
and C. M. Thorpe, who were appointed by John Patterson
chairman of the Board of County Commissioners

appointed to view a proposed road running from the west 1/4 Sec. Corner of Sec. 18
T. 3 N. R. 5 E.

to the Jordan Road intersecting the same near the N 1/4 Sec. Cor. of
Sec. 31 T. 4 N. R. 5 E.

as described in the annexed petition, say, That on the 29th day of June
A. D., 1900 we assembled at the place designated in the petition, as the starting point of such proposed
road and proceeded to view the same, and submit the following report:

1. The width of the proposed road, the description of the center line of the same, the length, how
defined, the marks and sources, grades, character of ground, description of the land and owners of the
same, over which the proposed road passes, and probable cost of constructing the said road, as follows:

The width of the proposed road is 60 feet
The description of the center line of the proposed road
is as follows to-wit: Beginning at the 1/4 Section
Corner between Section 18 T. 3 N. R. 5 E. and Section
13 T. 3 N. R. 4 E. thence north to swamp, thence N. by & N. W. by
around the east end of the swamp to section line between said
sections 18, & 13, thence north along section line to a
point near the N. W. corner of said Sec. 18, thence
North easterly crossing the N. line of said Sec. 18 about
100 feet East of the N. W. corner thereof, thence north easterly
running up the gulch along or near the road as now traveled
through Section 7 T. 3 N. R. 5 E. Crossing the north line of said
Section about 1/4 mile East of N. W. corner thereof, thence
northeasterly through Section 6 T. 3 N. R. 5 E. to the N. 1/4 Section
Corner of said Section 6. Thence northerly through the
SW 1/4 of Section 31 T. 4 N. R. 5 E. keeping near the East line
of the same to a point on the N. & S. 1/4 Section line a short distance
north of the center of said Section, thence north along said N. & S.
1/4 Sec. line to the Jordan Road, intersecting the same near the
N. 1/4 Sec. corner of said Sec. 31, the same being the terminus as
described in the petition. The length of the proposed
road is about 3 1/2 miles. The line of the proposed road
is defined by stakes, mounds of rock, blazed trees and
fence posts. A survey would be necessary to properly
establish the line of the road. The grades of the proposed
road would not exceed 8% when properly constructed.
The character of the ground is hard and suitable for road
building.

4. The estimate of damages in excess of benefits to the owner of any land over which it is proposed to run the highway, as follows:

Regarding the claim of L. S. Morgan we would recommend that the same be not allowed as we believe the benefits to his property resulting from said road will fully equal the damages. Regarding the claim of Mrs. J. Kamps, as she needs the road for marketing her grain and in getting to her land in Sec. 7 we believe the benefits to be derived from said road will fully equal all the damages to her property.

5. The following facts, bearing upon the subject, which may be of importance to the Board:

The proposed road is needed as an outlet for several settlers, also for school children in going to school as the site for the school house has been located at the starting point of the proposed road. The road is also needed for hauling grain to Mandan.

We believe said road _____ to be practical and _____ of public utility and necessity and do _____ recommend the establishment of the same.

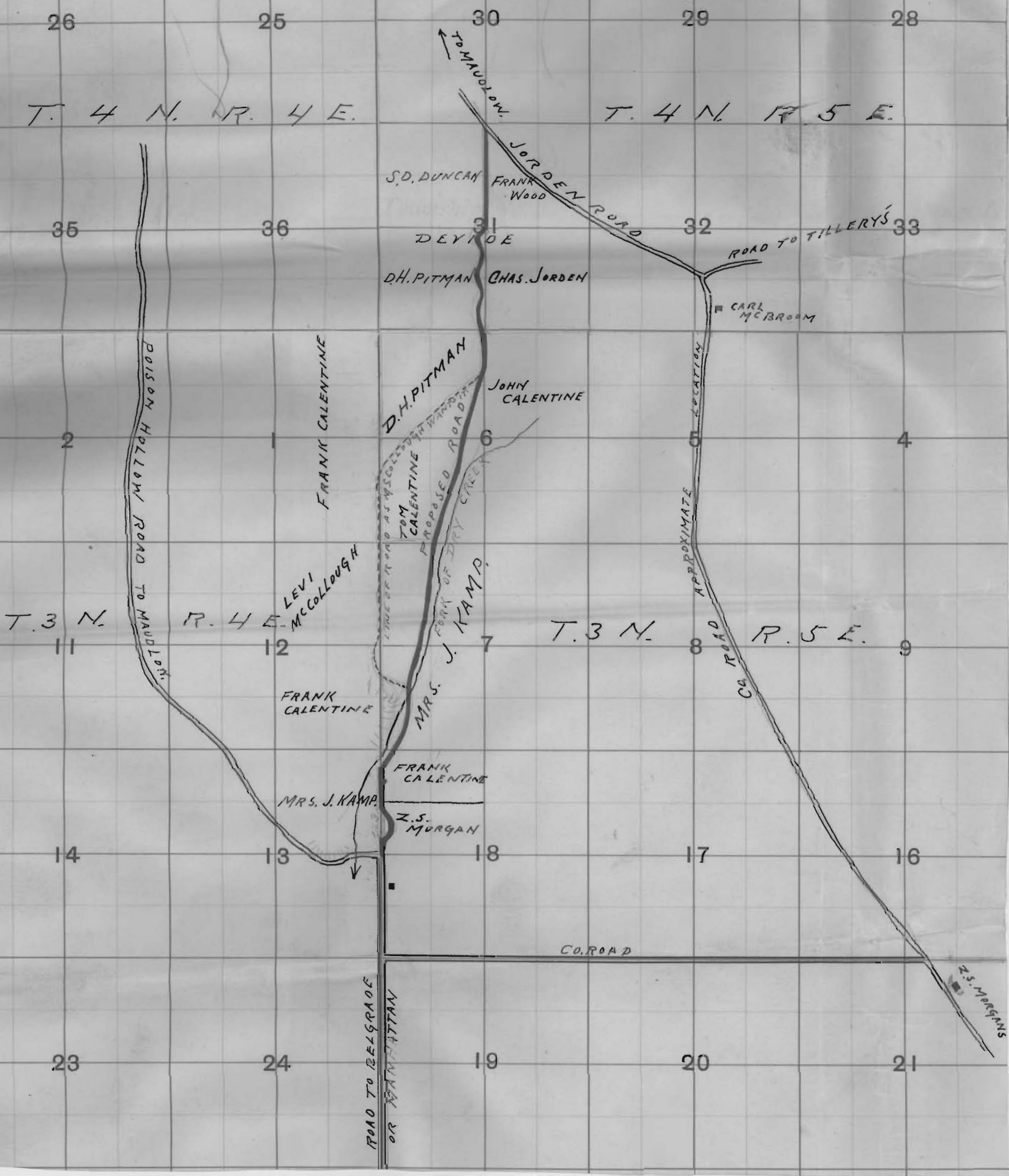
