PETITION FOR ROAD

TO THE HON. BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, of Gallatin County, Montana:

The Undersigned, Your petitioners, Citizens of the United States, respectfully show and represent that they are residents of Road District No. 4, in the County of Gallatin State of Montana, where the road, hereafter petitioned for, is to be located, laid out and established, if this petition be granted; that the proposed road is a public convenience, and, we think, the public good requires it.

Your petitioners do respectfully ask and petition that a County Road, sixty feet in width, to be a public highway, to be laid out, located and established and show:— (a) The general route of the proposed road; (b) over what lands it is proposed to be established; (c) who are the owners thereof; (d) whether such of them as can be found, consent thereto; (e) who of them do not consent; (f) the probable cost of the right-of-way where such consent is not had; (g) the necessity for and the advantages of the proposed road as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at the north $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. Cor. of Section 12, T. 3 S. R. 3 E, thence south 1 mile along the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. line, to the south $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. Cor. of said Sec 12

The land on the East of the proposed road is owned by Robert Eggeman. On the west by Mr. Inabmitt, & NW Corner.

The object of the proposed road is to avoid hills, and open a road from the Camp Creek Road to the Road running from Salisville to Elk Creek. The proposed road terminates at the Church, and school house, and will be a great convenience for school children and church people.

REPORT OF ROAD VIEWERS.

ROAD NO. 198

TO THE HONORABLE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF GALLATIN COUNTY, MONTANA:

We, the undersigned Road Viewers, consisting of G. L. Auneury, Renni
Moulton, and C. M. Wolfe, appointed by the
Board of County Commissioners on Nov. 14, 1901.

appointed to view a proposed road running from the North 1/4 Sec. Corner
of Sec. 12 T. 3 S., R. 3 E. South 1 mile

as described in the annexed petition, say, That on the 28th day of February
A. D., 1902 we assembled at the place designated in the petition, as the starting point of such proposed
road and proceeded to view the same, and submit the following report:

1. The width of the proposed road, the description of the center line of the same, the length, how
defined, the marks and sources, grades, character of ground, description of the land and owners of the
same, over which the proposed road passes, and probable cost of constructing the said road, as follows:

The width of the proposed road is 60 feet.
The description of the center line is as follows
to wit:— Beginning at the North 1/4 Sec. Corner, of
Section 12 T. 3 S., R. 3 E., thence South about
3/4 of a mile or to the portion of the hill near the South
1/4 Sec. Cor. of said Sec. 12 where the grade exceeds
10%, thence traversing the 1/4 Section line and
running S. W. ^{direct South} along the side of the hill on a grade not
exceeding 10% or 11% to the S. W. Corner of the school
lot. the corner being 10 rods west of said S. 1/4 Sec. Cor.
thence East to said S. 1/4 Sec. Cor. the corner being
the terminus of the road as petitioned for, at which
point it connects with a road running South and East.
The length of the proposed road is 1 mile.

The line of the proposed road is defined by the U.S. Gov.
corners, as far as the road follows said 1/4 Sec. line.
The grades will not exceed 11% when properly graded.

3. The names of the land owners who do not consent, and the amount of damages claimed by each, as follows:

J. M. Shuler claims \$250
C. Inabnit. claims \$100. on the line \$150. as to run into his land, as viewed.
J. B. Horner, ^{at grade} Claims \$75

4. The estimate of damages in excess of benefits to the owner of any land over which it is proposed to run the highway, as follows:

As J. M. Shuler offers to give the right of way on the east side of N.E. 1/4 of Sec. 12, and only asks pay on that line for moving his fence. And as we find the land on said east line nearly as good land as on his west line. We recommend that he be allowed the cost of moving his fence which we estimate at \$15 in excess of benefits. To C. Inabnit, \$15 for moving fence and \$25 for extra land. J. B. Horner \$15 for moving fence.

5. The following facts, bearing upon the subject, which may be of importance to the Board:

J. M. Shuler recommends that the road be laid out on the east line of said section 12 instead of on the line as petitioned for. We looked this line over and find it to be a more difficult route to build on, the hill has a grade of 20% and the ground is more broken, which it would not be as convenient in getting to school and church, on this line J. B. Horner's ^{claims} ^{for} ^{damages} J. M. Shuler, C. Inabnit, and J. B. Horner, are very much opposed to the road as petitioned for.

We believe said road _____ to be practical and _____ of public utility and necessity and do _____ recommend the establishment of the same.

The undersigned, Peter Ohmer, hereby respectfully shows to your Honorable Board that he is now, and since November 13, 1897, has been, the owner in fee simple of that certain tract of land lying and being in the County of Gallatin and State of Montana, described as follows, to-wit: The Northwest quarter (N.W. 1/4) of Section twelve (12), Township three (3) South, Range three (3) East, containing one hundred sixty acres according to the United States Government survey thereof and that said premises constitutes and is used as one farm, and that there is now a road and public highway along the north line of said farm and that the buildings on said farm are constructed near to and in conformity with such road.

That if the road petitioned to be laid out by B. F. 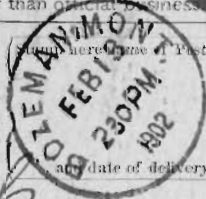
