Change of PETITION FOR ROAD

TO THE HON. BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, of Gallatin County, Montana:

The **Undersigned**, Your petitioners, Citizens of the United States, respectfully show and represent that they are residents of Road District No. 4, in the County of Gallatin State of Montana, where the road, hereafter petitioned for, is to be located, laid out and established, if this petition be granted; that the proposed road is a public convenience, and, we think, the public good requires it.

Your petitioners do respectfully ask and petition that a County Road, sixty feet in width, to be a public highway, to be laid out, located and established. and show:— (a) The general route of the proposed road; (b) over what lands it is proposed to be established; (c) who are the owners thereof; (d) whether such of them as can be found, consent thereto; (e) who of them do not consent; (f) the probable cost of the right-of-way where such consent is not had; (g) the necessity for and the advantages of the proposed road as follows, to-wit:

- (a) A 40 foot road commencing in the present established road, at the Southeast corner of Section Twenty Eight (28) in Township Three (3) South of Range Four (4) East thence to run South $\frac{1}{2}$ mile on Section line between Sections Thirty three (33) and Thirty four (34), ^{to gr. sec. cor.} same Top and Range, thence follow said Section line about one hundred and fifty yards, cross the West Gallatin Company's canal at the least named distance from the quarter Section corner, between Sections 33 and 34, before mentioned; thence in a Southwesterly direction following along the upper and East Bank of said canal as near as practicable to the Sheep Rock and terminate at said last named point, a point about 250 yards North of the South line of said Sec. 33, thence almost due South about 250 yards and join the old road approximately 150 yards West of Ira Williams' house, thence follow the present old road to the Sheep Rock and terminate at last named point. The old road running through the center and on South line of said Sec. 34 to be closed and discontinued.

NOTICE is hereby given that several resident freeholders and residents of Road District No. 4 of Gallatin County, State of Montana, have filed a petition in writing with the Clerk of the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Gallatin, State of Montana, said petition praying that a change be made in a County Road. The description of the same being as follows, to-wit:—A 40 foot right of way, commencing in the present established road, at the South east corner of Section Twenty Eight (28) in Township Three (3) South of Range Four (4) East, thence to run South 1/2 mile on Section line between Sections Thirty Three (33) and Thirty Four (34) to qr. REPORT OF ROAD VIEWERS.

ROAD NO. 200

TO THE HONORABLE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF GALLATIN COUNTY, MONTANA:

We, the undersigned Road Viewers, consisting of G.M. Hooper W. Bird Reid
& Wm Todd. appointed by the Board of County Commissioners
 on Mar. 3^d 1902

appointed to view a proposed road running from the south east corner of section
28 T.3 S. R.4 E South westerly.
 to Shoop rock

as described in the annexed petition, say, That on the 21st day of April
 A. D., 1902 we assembled at the place designated in the petition, as the starting point of such proposed
 road and proceeded to view the same, and submit the following report:

1. The width of the proposed road, the description of the center line of the same, the length, how
 defined, the marks and sources, grades, character of ground, description of the land and owners of the
 same, over which the proposed road passes, and probable cost of constructing the said road, as follows:

The width of the proposed road is 40 feet.
 The description of the center line as viewed, is as follows
 to wit:— Beginning at the south east corner of Sec. 28 T.3 S.
 R.4 E. thence west along the established road to a point
 about 110 feet east of the N.E. corner of the N.W. 1/4 of
 the N.E. 1/4 of Sec. 33 T.3 S. R.4 E. thence south westerly
 keeping west of W.A.R. Walters house to a point on the south east
 side of the Knoll ditch, thence in a southwesterly direction
 along said ditch on said S.E. side and at least 20 feet
 distance therefrom to the west line of the east half of ^{said} Sec. 33 thence
 south along said line to the south side of said section 33,
 thence south along the East line of the N.W. 1/4 of Sec. 4, T.4 S.
 R.4 E. to a point in the old road said point being on the

The probable cost of constructing the proposed road is as follows

at Knoll ditch culvert 3x6x16 (stone abutments)	\$40.00
2 culverts 1x2x16 at irrigating ditches (stone abutments)	30.00
at West Seltzer Cr. Canal 18 ft bridge. Stone abutments.	60.00
Grading	35.00
Gate Cost. of new portion of road.	165.00

The old portion of the road should have a small amount of grading, and should have the rocks removed.

We believe the above expense will be much less than would be required to repair the East and west portion of the old road which we recommend to be vacated. And the proposed road will be a much better road than the old one could be made.

3. The names of the land owners who do not consent, and the amount of damages claimed by each, as follows:

W. A. R. Walters. Consents to give the land, but claims the cost of 340 rods of fence. \$135.00

4. The estimate of damages in excess of benefits to the owner of any land over which it is proposed to run the highway, as follows:

We recommend that W. A. R. Walters, be allowed the cost of one fence through his land 340 rods which we estimate to cost \$135.00.

5. The following facts, bearing upon the subject, which may be of importance to the Board:

We find the road as petitioned for passes over rough ground with steep grades. For this reason we did not follow the petition but revised the road as above described. We believe the road as revised will be a greater public benefit than the road as petitioned for and satisfactory to all parties. We recommend the location of the old road along the S. side of S.E. 1/4 of Sec. 33 from the point where the above described road intersects the same east to the south 1/4 Sec. corner of Sec. 34 T. 3 S. R. 4 E. But do not recommend the location of the north and south road through the center of said Sec. 34 as it is needed by S. B. Kratter as an outlet, and also as a road to timber.

We believe said road to be practical and of public utility and necessity and do recommend the establishment of the same.
