PETITION FOR ROAD

TO THE HON. BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, of Gallatin County, Montana:

The Undersigned, ^{Freeholders} Your petitioners, Citizens of the United States, respectfully show and represent that they are residents of Road District No. 6, in the County of Gallatin State of Montana, where the road, hereafter petitioned for, is to be located, laid out and established, if this petition be granted; that the proposed road is a public convenience, and, we think, the public good requires it.

Your petitioners do respectfully ask and petition that a County Road, ^{Fourty feet} ~~Twenty feet~~ in width, to be a public highway, to be laid out, located and established. and show:— (a) The general route of the proposed road; (b) over what lands it is proposed to be established; (c) who are the owners thereof; (d) whether such of them as can be found, consent thereto; (e) who of them do not consent; (f) the probable cost of the right-of-way where such consent is not had; (g) the necessity for and the advantages of the proposed road as follows, to-wit:

Commencing at the Sines and Lewis road at the center of the South side of Section 27, in Township 3 North of Range 4 East, on the division line of said Section; thence running North through said Section 27 along the division line thereof one (1) mile. Said land being owned by Mrs. D.F. Cowan, who consents to said road, but asks \$250.00 damage therefore; thence running ^{North} one (1) mile through the middle of Section 22 over the lands owned by H.M. Edwards, C. Richards and Will Callantine; thence West one half (1/2) mile over the lands of H.M. Edwards and Mrs. A.C. Russell; thence North one (1) mile along the Section line between Sections 15 and 16 over the land owned by Mrs. A.C. Russell and school Section 16 leased by J.M. Buler; thence East along the Section line between Sections 10, 11, 12 and 13 two and one half (2 1/2) miles to the Northeast corner of the Northwest quarter of said Section 13, intersecting there the Dry Creek Road to Maudlow over the lands owned by W.D. Brainard, E.A. Douglas, Charles Callaghan, J. Reed, Mrs. A.C. Russell, Pete Neunfeldt, E. Callantine and C. Meyers, all of said parties consenting to the establishment of said road, and all consent to a right-of-way. Mrs. A.C. Russell claiming, however, the price of two wires along the line of said proposed road. The necessity of the proposed road and the advantages thereof are as follows:—

There is now no public road leading into said Section, as will be found by reference to the map hereto attached, which necessitates a large number of gates, etc., that are a great inconvenience to the land owners situated away from the Sines and Lewis road and the regular Dry Creek Road. For a more complete discription, reference is hereby made to the map hereto attached.

TO THE HONORABLE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF GALLATIN COUNTY, MONTANA:

We, the undersigned Road Viewers, consisting of Paul Christman, J. W. Haley,
and C. M. Thorpe. appointed by the Board of

A. D., 1903 we assembled at the place designated in the petition, as the starting point of such proposed

1. The width of the proposed road, the description of the center line of the same, the length, how
defined, the marks and sources, grades, character of ground, description of the land and owners of the
same, over which the proposed road passes, and probable cost of constructing the said road, as follows:

The width of the proposed road is 40 feet.

3. The names of the land owners who do not consent, and the amount of damages claimed by each, as follows:

Mrs. D. F. Cowan claims \$250.00 on line as viewed
East of her cultivated land. On line as petition
for through center of Sec. 27 she claims \$600.00 damages.
Mrs. A. C. Russell claims for extra fence \$75.00
Peter Knuffeldt claims \$50.00 for fence where road runs through
the N.E. 1/4 of Section 14. Charlie Myers claims \$90.00 for fence
through N.W. 1/4 of Section 13 and asks to have a Stock Pass built.

4. The estimate of damages in excess of benefits to the owner of any land over which it is proposed to run the highway, as follows:

As Mrs. Cowan has a County road to her land.
We would recommend that she be allowed \$250.00
damages in excess of benefits, the same being about the
cost of fence, land and stock pass, the stock pass
to be built and kept in repair by her. We would
recommend that Mrs. A. C. Russell be allowed \$75.00
the cost of wire for the extra fence which she will be
obliged to build as the road runs around her land a distance of 2 1/2

5. The following facts, bearing upon the subject, which may be of importance to the Board:

Her change was made through Mrs. Cowan's land from
the north and south 1/4 section line of Sec. 27 as petitioned
for to run East of her cultivated land, as the said 1/4
sec line runs through her best land, and land that
is not as good for road building as the land where
we have viewed the road. We looked over a proposed
change from the line as petitioned for on the west line
of sections 22 and 27. and found the expense of building
a road along or near that line would be greater than
the cost when viewed with Mrs. Cowan's damages included, and
would not make as good a road, and would not serve the same purpose

We believe said road _____ to be practical and _____ of public utility and
necessity and do _____ recommend the establishment of the same.

No 4 Continued. We would recommend that Peter Newfeldt be allowed \$50⁰⁰ for fence wire. And that Charles Myers be allowed \$90⁰⁰ for fence and a Stock Pass.

Both of the above named land owners would give the right of way along the section line on north side of their lands without expense to the County, but this line passes over rough ground with one long hill of 12 to 14 to grade, and on this line J. Reed asks the cost of extra fence. We therefore recommend as above, as it is cheaper to pay the damages than to construct the road on the section line, and a very much better road would be obtained.

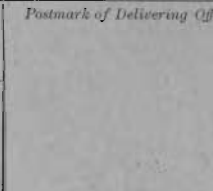

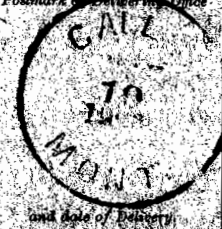

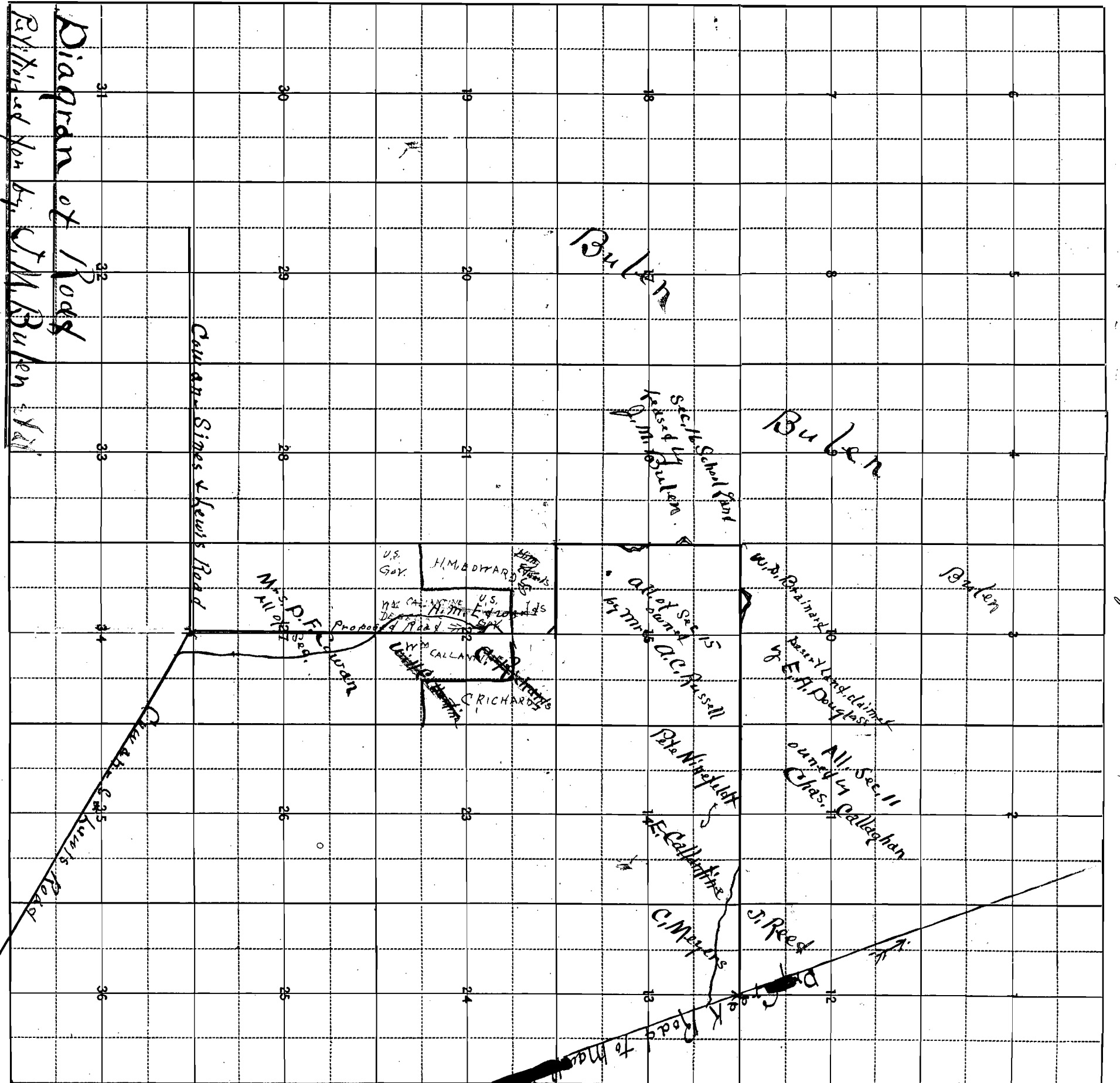


Diagram of Road
