We looked over the line of road as petitioned for in sec. 36 and found it to be an expensive piece of road to build with a grade of 16% which could not be avoided. We therefore looked up a better route and have viewed the road to run from the Bridgw road south eastward through the S.E. 1/4 of said sec. 36 running up a gulch, which will make a saving in construction of \$170.00 and give the public a good natural road.

We believe said road to be practical and of public utility and necessity and do recommend the establishment of the same.

The width of the proposed road is 30 feet.

Corner of said Section 36; thence East along the South line of said Sec. 36 to the Southeast corner thereof except at the hill East of the gulch where we viewed the road to run around the hill South of the Sec. line to obtain a suitable grade.
