## Petition For Road.

To The Hon. Board of County Commissioners, of Gallatin County, Mont.:

**The Undersigned.** Your petitioners, Citizens of the United States, respectfully show and represent that they are residents of and freeholders in Road District No. 8, in the County of Gallatin, State of Montana, and taxable therein for road purposes, where the road, hereafter petitioned for, is to be located, laid out and established, if this petition be granted; that the proposed road is a public convenience, and, we think, the public good requires it.

Your petitioners do respectfully ask and petition that a County Road Fifty feet in width, to be a public highway, to be laid out, located and established.

And show:

- (a) The general route of the proposed road.
- (b) Over what lands it is proposed to be established.
- (c) Who are the owners thereof.
- (d) Whether such of them as can be found, consent thereto.
- (e) Who of them do not consent.
- (f) The probable cost of such right-of-way where such consent is not had.
- (g) The necessity for and advantages of the proposed road as follows, to-wit:

(a) Beginning at a point in Section 33 T. 1 S. R. 3 E. on the Camp Creek Road, & then running north easterly by the most suitable route through said Section 33, and Sections 34 and 35, and intersecting the proposed road in the West 1/2 of Section 35 as petitioned for by John Weidmann et al -

(c) Section 33 is owned by the W. G. I. Co.

(d) None

# REPORT OF ROAD VIEWERS.

ROAD NO. 254

TO THE HONORABLE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF GALLATIN COUNTY, MONTANA:

We, the undersigned Road Viewers, consisting of D. Cameron, H. Herb  
and C.M. Thorpe

appointed to view a proposed road running from the road on Camp Creek on Sec 33  
Eastly  
to the proposed road in Sec. 35 as petitioned for by John Weidenaar  
as described in the annexed petition, say, That on the 27<sup>th</sup> day of Apr  
A. D., 1905 we assembled at the place designated in the petition, as the starting point of such proposed road and proceeded to view the same, and submit the following report:

1. The width of the proposed road, the description of the center line of the same, the length, how defined, the marks and sources, grades, character of ground, description of the land and owners of the same, over which the proposed road passes, and probable cost of constructing the said road, as follows:

The width of the proposed road is 40 feet.  
The description of the center line is as follows w-wt: -  
Beginning at a point in the County Road known  
as the Camp Creek Road near the spring on Sec 33  
T. 1 S. R. 3 E., thence north easterly along or near the traveled  
road crossing Camp Creek at their present crossing  
and following along or near the road as now traveled  
through section 33 and to the summit on Sec. 34, said T. & R.  
thence crossing the ditch leading from the W.G.I. Co. Canal  
and running down the gulch in a north easterly direction  
running south of Mr. Ellings house and connection  
with the proposed John Weidenaar road in the gulch on  
Section 35, T. 1 S. R. 3 E.

The length of the proposed road is about 2 miles.  
The line of the road is defined by stakes & blazed posts.  
The grades will not exceed 8% when properly graded.  
The character of the ground is suitable for road building.  
The description of land over which the proposed road runs  
and names of land owners are annexed sketch.  
The probable cost of constructing the proposed road is \$120,000

At a meeting of the State Board of Land Commissioners held this day, Mr Henry Neill, State Land Agent submitted the following reports.

Hon. State Board of Land Commissioners

Helena, Mont.

Gentlemen:-

I visited sec 34 T. 1 S.R. 3 E., which is now under lease to J. Elling. I find this sec. a very rough and broken section. The route which the county has laid a road through comes up a ravine and destroys very little arable land, until it reaches about the center of the section where it crosses land that can be tilled for a short distance, perhaps 500 feet. It then strikes into another rough portion of the sec. and then goes out. At present there are two roads running through this land which damage it more than this county road would. I would recommend that the Commissioners be granted the right to build this road provided, the County will fence it on each side, believing that this road gives a permanent outlet from this land and will prove a great benefit to the community lying north.

Gentlemen:-

This road runs up through a coulee that breaks through sec. 26. This road of Klulist is to join the one of Ellings. Mr. Klulist has no objections to the construction of the road, provided, it is fenced. In the letter of A.A.Cameron, Co. Clerk, to the Register of State lands, he says that the viewers allowed the State \$144. for building one mile of fence, that is one-half mile on each side of the road, through sec. 26. I would suggest that the Board have the county build the fence, it will then be done. This road in connection with the portion that passes through sec. 34 will be a great accomodation to a large community and very little damage to the State lands. In fact, it is a benefit as it allows the settlers to get their grain to Belgrade by a much easier route than the old one they have been using.

Dear Sir:

I beg to acknowledge receipt of your favor of 29th ult., enclosing consents for right of way for roads, together with plat showing line of such proposed roads.

I wish you would again take the map and look at the proposed roads across the West half of Section 35. I do not think, Mr. Thorpe, if you were in my position, you would feel like consenting to a right of way across this land in any such shape as it is proposed to run the road. I am now and have always been willing to encourage the laying out of new roads and you have never yet asked for my consent to a road which has not been readily given, unless the proposed road was laid out in such a way as to materially damage the property. The road which is proposed through Section 35 would almost make that half of the section unsaleable, and when residents of the district spoke to me last Fall about this proposed road, I objected to their placing it through Section 35 in any such manner as they propose to run it, and I certainly am opposed to it now.

I will be in Bozeman within a few days and will discuss the matter with you in person while there.

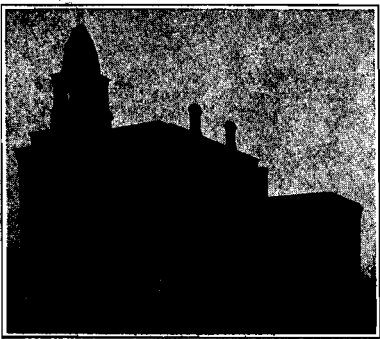

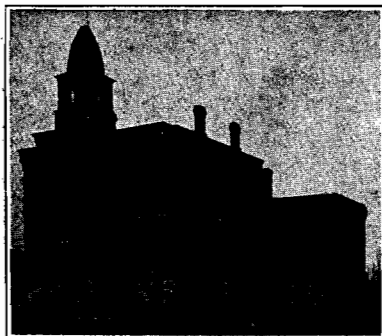
