# Petition For Road.

To The Hon. Board of County Commissioners, of Gallatin County, Mont.:

**The Undersigned,** Your petitioners, Citizens of the United States, respectfully show and represent that they are residents of and freeholders in Road District No. 236, in the County of Gallatin, State of Montana, and taxable therein for road purposes, where the road, hereafter petitioned for, is to be located, laid out and established, if this petition be granted; that the proposed road is a public convenience, and, we think, the public good requires it.

Your petitioners do respectfully ask and petition that a County Road Sixty (60) feet in width, to be a public highway, to be laid out, located and established.

And show:

- (a) The general route of the proposed road.
- (b) Over what lands it is proposed to be established.
- (c) Who are the owners thereof.
- (d) Whether such of them as can be found, consent thereto.
- (e) Who of them do not consent.
- (f) The probable cost of such right-of-way where such consent is not had.
- (g) The necessity for and advantages of the proposed road as follows, to-wit:

A) Beginning at the N. E. Corner of the Manhattan townsite, thence running North  $1\frac{1}{2}$  miles, thence West  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile, thence North  $\frac{3}{4}$  of a mile crossing the Gallatin river, thence up along the Northern bank of the river about  $\frac{1}{4}$  of a mile to the <sup>NE corner</sup> of what is known as Nixon's Gulch, which point is one the S. E. quarter of section 27, 2 North, Range 3 East, thence running Northeasterly along the said Nixon's Gulch passing out of section 27 about the N. E. corner, continuing Northeasterly crossing section 23, striking section 14 about the south Center, thence following said gulch into section 14 to the O. P. Chisholm's Onyx quarry, thence running Northeasterly from said gulch up thru' Chisholm's Onyx property, also crossing J. C. Mc Daniels' Onyx land to the Northeast corner of section 14 and 12, thence east one mile near S. E. corner of sections 12 and 7, intersecting the now travelled road, following this road North to the creek near Poff's thence East on present road  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile thence north to creek, thence East, following present road to Mt Zion school house to the present public road.

## REPORT OF ROAD VIEWERS.

ROAD NO. 266

TO THE HONORABLE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF GALLATIN COUNTY, MONTANA:

We, the undersigned Road Viewers, consisting of

G. M. Thorpe  
John Cowan & Sam Gibson

appointed to view a proposed road running from Manhattan

to the Horvath basin

as described in the annexed petition, say, That on the 26<sup>th</sup> day of Sept.

A. D., 1905 we assembled at the place designated in the petition, as the starting point of such proposed road and proceeded to view the same, and submit the following report:

1. The width of the proposed road, the description of the center line of the same, the length, how defined, the marks and sources, grades, character of ground, description of the land and owners of the same, over which the proposed road passes, and probable cost of constructing the said road, as follows:

The width of the proposed road is 60 feet.

The description of the center line of the proposed road is as follows to-wit:— Beginning at the S.E. Corner of Section 3 T. 1 N., R. 3 E., the same being the N.E. Corner of the Manhattan Township, thence north along the section line between sections 2 & 3 said T. & R. and between sections 34 and 35 T. 2 N., R. 3 E., to or near the south side of the West Gallatin River, thence north  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile to N.  $\frac{1}{4}$  Sec. Cor. 34<sup>th</sup> Sec. north Easterly ~~thence~~ ~~west~~ ~~along~~ ~~said~~ ~~river~~ to opposite the rock bluff to the proposed bridge site on the S.E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  of Sec. 27 said T. & R., thence crossing said river and running up along the north side to the mouth of the Nixon Gulch, thence being on the said S.E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  of Sec. 27, thence running N. by up said gulch passing out of Sec. 27 near the N.E. Corner thereof, thence continuing up said gulch through Sec. 23 and into Sec. 14 to the P. Christopher Camp ground, thence running up a gulch to the East of said quarry, to the N.E. Corner of Sec. 14, thence east along or near the south line of Sec. 12 said T. & R. about  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile, thence South Easterly along or near a gulch to the old Ogle River, thence following along or near said old road in a North Easterly direction to or near the creek near Y.E. Poff's, thence east along or near the traveled road, turning South of the same to the established road intersecting the same near the N.W. Corner of Sec. 5 T. 2 N., R. 4 E., near the Mt. Zion School House, the length of the proposed road is about 10 miles

The line of the proposed road is defined by the U.S. Gov. Corner, by Morris Gulch & by the old road & stakes set along the proposed road.

The grades will not exceed 12% when properly graded the character of the ground is suitable for road building.

For description of land and names of owners over which the proposed road passes see accompanying map.

The probable cost of constructing the road is ~~\$150000~~ \$175000. This does not include the bridge over the Gallatin which is not needed at present and is not asked for as there is a good ford where teams hauling stone cross.

4. The estimate of damages in excess of benefits to the owner of any land over which it is proposed to run the highway, as follows:

We find along Mrs. Baker's land where he claims damages that there is an open graded road and has been for years with fence more than 30 ft. from the line, we believe his benefits will fully equal all damages.  
We believe the benefits to the Darter Estate will fully equal all damages as there is no road to the place.  
We believe the benefits to Mrs. J. Lewis will fully equal the damages.  
We believe the benefits to the Manhattan Co. & the Manhattan Matting Co. will fully equal the damages.

5. The following facts, bearing upon the subject, which may be of importance to the Board:

~~the object of changing the road from the line as petitioned for is to avoid swamping land and to obtain a more direct route with better road material.~~

We find the country tributary to this road is rapidly settling up, and that the road is needed as an outlet for settlers, also needed to open up the Ouzo prospects, and for hauling building rock.

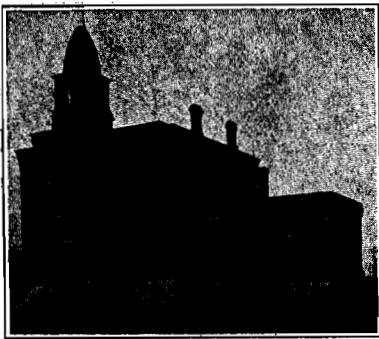

Gentlemen:-

I would respectfully report to your honorable body that I have made a survey of the H.W. Nelson Road, No. 266, from Manhattan to the Lewis place. At the Lewis place we were stopped by Mrs. Lewis who claimed that the right of way through their place had not been settled for and who seemed very much wrought up over the matter and ordered us off from the place, threatening to use a gun if we continued. Mr. Lewis had fenced leaving a right of way for a road along the south and east sides of his place which runs up onto a mountainside and down again and crosses a deep gulch. It would be necessary to view this change before the same could legally be made. Another change from the line, as viewed, is desired by Mr. Reynolds on Sec. 7, where he wishes it changed to the west and north sides of said Sec. On this route the hills are much heavier than on the route as originally viewed, and, as right of way had never been secured along this line, we made the survey on the line as originally viewed.

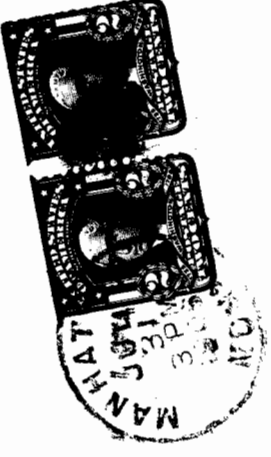

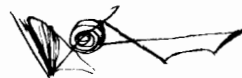

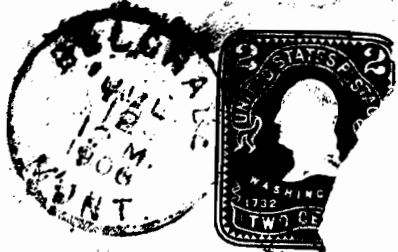
