Petition for Road.

To The Hon. Board of County Commissioners, of Gallatin County, Mont.:

THE UNDERSIGNED, Your petitioners, Citizens of the United States, respectfully show and represent that they are residents of and freeholders in Road District No. *7. Seven*, in the County of Gallatin, State of Montana, and taxable therein for road purposes, where the road, hereinafter petitioned for, is to be located, laid out and established, if this petition be granted; that the proposed road is a public convenience, and, we think, the public good requires it.

Your petitioners do respectfully ask and petition that a County Road..... feet in width, to be a public highway, to be laid out, located and established.

And show

- (a) The general route of the proposed road.
- (b) Over what lands it is proposed to be established.
- (c) Who are the owners thereof.
- (d) Whether such of them as can be found, consent thereto.
- (e) Who of them do not consent.
- (f) The probable cost of such right-of-way where such consent is not had.
- (g) The necessity for and advantages of the proposed road as follows, to-wit:

The road applied for in this petition is necessary for the public at large doing no damage to any one, the opening there of not to exceed ten dollars cost to the county. The aforesaid road runs between the ranches of Mr. Haley and Thos. Torrey. Mr. Haley is on Sec. 7 T. 2 N. of Range 7 E. Mr. Torrey is on Sec. 12 T. 2 N. 6 E.

This is only a continuation of the road already opened which intersects the road through Flat Head pass and which stops at the north corner of Mr. Torrey's ranche. We want this road continued south to Mr. Torrey's south gate, thence west on Mr. Carroll's old road to his gate. This takes in no ground valuable for tillable purposes. By asking your supervisor of this district, Mr. Hudson, he can explain it to you as he has been over the ground. The only party objecting to this road is Mrs. Thos. Torrey, who deprives Mr. Carroll and the public at large, going to and

from Mr. Carroll's ranche as Mr. Jorney
 has it part-wire fenced.
 Mr. Thos. Kirk and Mr. J. A. Davis were
 over and saw for themselves that
 this road was needed.

We the undersigned ask your honorable
 body of Commissioners for your early
 attention to this and we will feel
 greatly obliged.

would intersect about 200 yards west of

and \$25 for grading a hillside and building one
culvert*
