# Petition for Road

To The Hon. Board of County Commissioners, of Gallatin County, Mont.:

THE UNDERSIGNED, Your petitioners, Citizens of the United States, respectfully show and represent that they are residents and freeholders in Road District No. \_\_\_\_\_, in the County of Gallatin, State of Montana, and taxable therein for road purposes, when the road, hereinafter petitioned for, is to be located, laid out and established, if this petition be granted; that the proposed road is a public convenience, and, we think, the public good requires it.

Your petitioners do respectfully ask and petition that a County Road \_\_\_\_\_ 40 ft. feet in width, to be a public highway, to be laid out, located and established.

And show

- (a) The general route of the proposed road. E and W.
- (b) Over what lands it is proposed to be established. Between Sec # 25 T 36 R 12 S 28
- (c) Who are the owners thereof. J. W. Black owns sec 25 and John Ahramest owns 26
- (d) Whether such of them as can be found, consent thereto. yes
- (e) Who of them do not consent. none
- (f) The probable cost of such right-of-way where such consent is not had. none

(g) The necessity for and advantages of the proposed road as follows, to-wit:

Dear Sir:-

In 1912 a petition for a County Road along the North line of Sec. 36, T. 1 S., R. 2 E., which you own, was presented to the Board of County Commissioners and was held up for the reason that no right of way could be obtained from you at that time.

Another petition has been presented in order to connect up dead ends of two roads, that a mail route may be obtained in this locality. This new petition as you know calls for right of way along the west side of said section 36 and I am informed that you have agreed to give 15 feet along this line. As this road connects with the petition mentioned first and that is still waiting for right of way from you I am inclosing an agreement for right of way along both lines.

As the Commissioners do not allow a road of less width than 40 feet this agreement calls for twenty feet along both lines. All parties have agreed to give right of way except yourself and the petitioners felt that if you understood the matter you would readily agree to give your share.

The getting of a mail route depends entirely on getting this road and as all parties in this locality are very much interested I hope I may receive an early and favorable reply.

The new road which is along your two sections is all finished except a grade at the north east corner of section 36 which you own. We find that by swinging the road over on your land we can get a much better grade along here as well as accheaper one. I have surveyed a grade which runs over on your land a find that as I have made the survey we will need two and one half acres of your land. This land is practically all on a rocky side hill which you do not farm and never will.

The County Commissioners have authorized me to offer you \$75.00 for the privillidge of building this grade on o on your land. We of course will build all necessary fence to fence the change. We have a road man in that neighborhood at present and would like to do this work right away, so I wish you would wire me collect if you care to accept this offer.
