Petition for Road

To The Hon. Board of County Commissioners, of Gallatin County, Mont.:

THE UNDERSIGNED, Your petitioners, Citizens of the United States, respectfully show and represent that they are residents and freeholders in Road District No. 6, in the County of Gallatin, State of Montana, and taxable therein for road purposes, when the road, hereinafter petitioned for, is to be located, laid out and established, if this petition be granted; that the proposed road is a public convenience, and, we think, the public good requires it.

Your petitioners do respectfully ask and petition that a County Road 40 feet in width, to be a public highway, to be laid out, located and established.

And show

- (a) The general route of the proposed road.
- (b) Over what lands it is proposed to be established.
- (c) Who are the owners thereof.
- (d) Whether such of them as can be found, consent thereto.
- (e) Who of them do not consent.
- (f) The probable cost of such right-of-way where such consent is not had.
- (g) The necessity for and advantages of the proposed road as follows, to-wit:

(a) Beginning at SW cor. SE 1/4, Sec, 10, 27, 4 E, running East on sec line between secs 10 & 15 - 11 & 14. With exceptions of SE 1/4 of sec 11 where it leaves sec line & runs in a N.E. direction to get down hill to intersect R.R. crossing on Dry Creek Branch of Chicago Milwaukee R.R. a distance of about 300 yds from SE cor of sec 11 D thence connecting with Main Dry Creek wagon Road.

(b) Secs 10, 11, 14 & 15.

Dear Sir:

Report has been received from Land Examiner Cooney,
regarding the proposed county road in Section 11-2N-4E.

Mr. Cooney reports that the Commissioners have de-
cided the road is to be built along the south line of the
section for about three-quarters of a mile, but in the $SE\frac{1}{4}SE\frac{1}{4}$
it is necessary to cut across that forty in order to avoid an
abrupt slope. He states that the Commissioners are willing
to fence in the road on either side from the point where it
turns north into the section and clear across the $SE\frac{1}{4}SE\frac{1}{4}$,
provided this Company will grant an easement for the road
without charge.

If the Commissioners will arrange so that gates
will be put in, one on the north side of the road and the
other on the south side of the road, so as to give access to
the detached portions of this forty, this Company will be
willing to accede to the proposition and grant an easement

for a nominal consideration for roadway to be laid out in the proposed location.

The land is now held under lease and we will have to make arrangements with our lessee before the easement can be granted, but as soon as we hear definitely that the Commissioners will accept this proposition I will get in communication with our lessee and arrange accordingly.
