We, the undersigned, respectfully petition the Honorable Board of County Commissioners of Gallatin County for an order to close the following County Road; running north between the South half of the Southwest quarter (S $\frac{1}{2}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$) and the South half of the Southeast quarter (S $\frac{1}{2}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$), and west between the South half of the Southwest quarter (S $\frac{1}{2}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$) and the north half of the Southwest quarter N $\frac{1}{2}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$, of Section Twenty-two (22) ^{Twp 3 So Range 4 E} and further described as the lane leading to the Kit Etherington Ranch house from the red granary located at the intersection of the half-section between Sections Twenty-two and Section Twenty-seven Twp 3 So Range 4 East.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN That a Petition was filed with the Board of County Commissioners, signed by ten freeholders taxable in Road District No. 26, which Petition was in writing and prayed for the abandonment of that certain highway

described as follows: Beginning at the south quarter corner of ~~said~~ section 22, twp 3 S, R 4 E, thence northerly along the north and south center line of said section 22, 1317' to the northeast corner of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of said section 22; thence westerly along the north line of the S $\frac{1}{2}$ of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of said Section 22, a distance of 1816 feet.

That, at a regular meeting of the Board of County Commissioners, held at the Court House in the City of Bozeman, on the 1st day of July, 1924, the said Board of County Commissioners caused an investigation to be made into the feasibility and desirability of granting the prayer of said Petition and did, then and there, cause such investigation to be had as was deemed necessary to properly determine the merits of said Petition and that, thereupon, a member of the Board of County Commissioners and the County Surveyor viewed said premises and made a complete investigation as to the feasibility and desirability of abandoning said highway and did then and there order the abandonment of said highway and did further order that notice of such decision be sent by registered mail to the parties interested therein of their findings on said petition, and did further order that three copies of such Notice be posted in three conspicuous places along said abandoned highway.
