OBJECTION TO CLOSING PUBLIC HIGHWAY

TO THE HONORABLE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF GALLATIN COUNTY, MONTANA:

Gentlemen:

The undersigned, the Board of Trustees of Beloit College, hereby protests against and objects to the closing of that portion of the public highway designated County Road No. 39, described as follows:

That portion of County Road No. 39 beginns at a point on the North line of Sec. 30, T. 1 N., R. 5 E., said point being one-fourth mile east of the Northwest Corner of said Sec. 30; thence due south 3/4 mile to the intersection of said County Road No. 39 and County Road No. 1. (The Penwell road);

on the following grounds and for the following reasons:

Said The Board of Trustees of Beloit College is the owner of the West Half of the West Half (W_2W_2) of Section Thirty (30), in Township One (1) North of Range Five (5) East, and the East Half (E_2) of Section Twentyfive (25), in Township One (1) North of Range Four (4) East, which land abutts and joins on the west side portion of said county road No. 39. A portion of said highway proposed to be vacated and discontinued, particularly the south end thereof for a distance of about one-eighth of a mile, is necessary for use and is used in connection with selling crops of hay from said land owned by the undersigned, and the whole of said portion of said highway proposed to be vacated is used at times in connection with the operation of said farm for the purpose of moving stock on said portion of said highway. The land owned by the undersigned and immediately joining said highway is used for pasture and is very wet and swampy and it is impossible to keep in repair the fence of the undersigned along the east side of its said land, except by the use of said highway and the part thereof proposed to be vacated, and said highway and the portion proposed to be vacated is used and is necessary to be used by the undersigned in having said fence repaired and kept in order.

The telephone line that serves a large number of patrons and known as the Reese Creek Telephone Line is constructed upon and extends through said portion of said highway proposed to be vacated, as is also the electric light line, known as the Dry Creek Electric Corporation, which serves a large number of users of electricity. That said telephone line and electric power line was placed upon said highway under authority of law and with the right to repair and maintain the same on said highway, and is a proper and lawful use of said highway, and such use and the other use which is made of said highway is such that it cannot be considered that said highway is unnecessary or that it should be abandonedor closed.

That the undersigned is interested in said electric light line and obtains electrical service from said line for the land owned by it, above

described, and said line extending north through said public highway also extends through other lands owned by the undersigned and will serve to furnish electricity for its other lands.
