




MEMORANDUM ACCOMPANYING ORDER

The Court has, pursuant to the Writ of Review heretofore granted in this matter, signed an Order annulling, setting aside and vacating a certain Resolution and Order of the Board of County Commissioners bearing date March 21, 1952, wherein said Board ordered closed, vacated and abandoned a certain road situated and located in the Rainbow Subdivision of the County of Gallatin, State of Montana. In order that the Board of County Commissioners and its legal adviser, the County Attorney, and all other persons interested, might know the basis of the Court's Order, I am filing herewith, and requesting the Clerk of the Court to serve upon the attorneys of record and the Board of County Commissioners, this Memorandum.

It is well to remember that the Court here is concerned not with the merits of the case; not with the reasonableness of the Board; not with the correctness of the Board's action; nor even with the practicality of the Board's action, but is concerned with only one question, and that question is the jurisdiction of the Board to act in the instant case.

In simple language, jurisdiction is the power to hear and determine a particular matter. The Board of County Commissioners is a creature of the law; whatever power, whatever right to act it

may have, must be found expressed or implied in the laws of this State. The law here is not clear and it is not too surprising that the County Attorney and the Board of County Commissioners have erred. It is obvious that before the Board of County Commissioners may make an Order, as they did on the 21st day of March, A. D., 1952, closing, vacating and abandoning a road, the requirements of the law must be observed.

Two possible avenues of approach were open to the Board of County Commissioners: First, they could proceed on the theory that this was a platted subdivision, and hold therefore, that a road, street or alleyway in said subdivision so platted, could be vacated under Section 11-2803, RCM 1947. There is considerable merit in such an approach in that the plat itself in its dedication clause states, and I quote: "...and that said survey and plat are made in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 6, Title 3, Part 4, of the Political Code of the State of Montana...", and the surveyor so subscribed to said dedication attached to the plat, and further stated that, and I again quote: "That iron monuments have been placed at the intersections of the center lines of the streets and avenues, and as indicated by a cross (X) on said plat." An examination of the plat shows these crosses, indicating the location of iron monuments, in the very road under consideration. If, and the Court does not so decide here, this could be held to be a subdivision of an abandoned townsite or village or vineyard tract or acreage tract or suburban tract or community tract, then, it seems clear that in order for the Board of County Commissioners to so act as they did, or at least to acquire jurisdiction, a petition to so abandon should be signed by all the owners of the land in such platted area.

Second, they could proceed on the theory that this is a road within a road district, as so considered under Section 32-401, RCM 1947. This they have done. But even then they must follow

the words of the statute concerned: That ten or a majority of the freeholders of the road district must petition. This was not done. It is clear that the entire County of Gallatin is a road district, therefore, [✓]the entire seventeen appearing on the petition for the abandoning of a public highway, and referred to in the cause as Plaintiff's Exhibit 7, would not be a majority of the freeholders of the County. Seventeen names of freeholders appear on Plaintiff's Exhibit 7, and apparently are checked as being "O.K."; nine of the same seventeen are found on another petition presented by Mr. Freeman to the Board of County Commissioners at the time of the public hearing on the matter on March 6, 1952. Now, it is true that the petition presented by Mr. Freeman does not have the legal clarity that is found on the petition presented by Mr. Hallstead to the Board of County Commissioners, but the Chairman of the Board of County Commissioners, Mr. J. O. E. Nelsen, testified in court that he read both petitions, and that there was no question as to the validity of the signatures, but nevertheless the Board of County Commissioners summarily dismissed the petition of Mr. Freeman and concerned themselves only with the petition of Mr. Hallstead. It is the opinion of this Court that the same force and effect should have been given to the Freeman petition (Plaintiff's Exhibit 6) as was given to the Hallstead petition (Plaintiff's Exhibit 7). The minimum requirements of the statute were not met. The Board's subsequent actions in this matter were therefore in excess of jurisdiction. The Board's right to act further did not exist.

This Court has concerned itself, not with the merits of the present controversy, but only as to whether or not the Board of County Commissioners exceeded its jurisdiction. This jurisdiction is a limited one, and it is well that it is, because the vacation and abandonment of roads is a serious matter and all of the requirements of the statute must be fully met, and there should be no

question of those requirements before the Board begins to act. In other words, the Court has decided here, not that the Board of County Commissioners cannot abandon and vacate a road within the County, but rather, that in the instant case they have exceeded the jurisdiction given to them by the statutes, because the preliminary requirements which must exist before they can even acquire jurisdiction, did not exist.

The return on the Writ of Review included a certain easement wherein Frank Hallstead and his wife, Mildred, conveyed to the County of Gallatin a certain easement in consideration for the Board discontinuing and vacating the road in question and providing that in the event that the road in question was reopened, by any means whatsoever, then, the easement granted would be terminated and at an end. The Board of County Commissioners acting as trustees for all the people of Gallatin County does not agree with private individuals, and for a consideration, to do that which they are bound to do, if they have the legal right so to do.

The Court has written this Memorandum fully realizing the difficulties involved in the procedure of closing a road, but well aware of the necessity for the Board of County Commissioners to act under the law and in accordance with it.

RESOLUTION CLOSING GALLATIN COUNTY ROAD, AS PETITIONED FOR BY PETITION #601, AND DESCRIBED THEREIN AND HEREINAFTER IN THE BODY OF RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS, Sections 32-401 through 32-404, R. C. M., 1947, provide for and authorize that the Board of County Commissioners of any County may discontinue, in a manner provided by law, a public highway petitioned to be closed pursuant to the above statutes; and

WHEREAS, Petition #601 for the closing of the following described County road, to-wit:

Commencing at a point between the South line of Lots No. 340 and 264 of Rainbow Subdivision of Bozeman Hot Springs Tract, Gallatin County, Montana, as now on file and recorded in the Office of the County Clerk and Recorder of Gallatin County, Montana;

Thence running North between Lots No. 264, 263, and 262, to the South line of Lot No. 261, which lie on the West side of the road in question, and Lots No. 340, 341, 342, 343, 344, 345, 346 and that portion of Lot 347, which lie on the East side of said road, to a point on the West line of Lot No. 347, which is due East of the South line of Lot No. 261.

was filed with the Board of County Commissioners of Gallatin County, Montana, on the 24th day of April, 1951, and which Petition contained the names of ten qualified free-holders who were, either adjoining land owners or resided in said road district, said Petition having been presented to the said Board of County Commissioners as provided by the provisions in Sections 32-401 and 32-402, R. C. M., 1947, and

WHEREAS, on the 27th day of April, 1951, the said Board of County Commissioners, all members being present, met in extra session and at said session the Board appointed themselves as a Board of Viewers on Petition No. 601; and

WHEREAS, on the 30th day of April, 1951, the Board of County Commissioners, as the Board of Viewers on Petition No. 601, viewed the above-described road petitioned to be closed and caused investigation to determine the merits of the Petition as provided for by Sections 32-403 and 32-407, R. C. M., 1947, and did, therefore, on the 30th day of April, 1951, cause notice of hearing on said Petition to be sent, by registered mail, to all of the petitioners and adjoining land owners abutting said County road, stating that the matter had been set for hearing and protest could be presented at the office of the County Commissioners on the 14th day of May, 1951, at 10 o'clock A. M.; and

WHEREAS, on the 14th day of May, 1951, at 10 o'clock A. M., time set for the hearing of the protest, no person or persons appeared or protested the closing of the above described County road, and, at that time a motion was made, seconded, and carried that the Road be officially closed with the proviso that the County of Gallatin, State of Montana, obtain an easement from Frank E. Hallstead et ux for a certain portion of land between Lots No. 357 and 384, and between Lots No. 356 and 385 of the Rainbow Subdivision of the Bozeman Hot Springs Tract, Gallatin County, Montana; and

WHEREAS, on the 21st day of June, 1951, the following described easement was granted and conveyed to the County of Gallatin, State of Montana, by Frank E. Hallstead and Mildred Hallstead, husband and wife of Gallatin County, Montana, described as follows:

Commencing at a point on the North line of said Lot No. 356, said point being 100 feet East of the Northwest Corner of said lot, thence from said point of beginning, West along the said North line 100 feet to the Northwest corner of said Lot No. 356; thence South along the West line of said lot a distance of 40 feet; thence Northeasterly a distance of 113.5 feet to the place of beginning, containing 0.046 of an acre, more or less; and

WHEREAS, the said Board of County Commissioners on the 24th day of November, 1951, at an extra session, all members being present, duly considered the Petition filed herein, the report of the investigatory board, and such other information as individual members of the Board of County Commissioners had, and the further fact that an easement for right-of-way had been obtained, and

WHEREAS, after duly and fully considering the fact in the law, said Board of County Commissioners unanimously determined and decided as follows:

1. That the Petition filed in this matter contains sufficient qualified signers, as required by the provisions of the Statute;
2. That no serious financial loss will occur to any of the adjoining land owners;
3. That all of the abutting land owners along said County Road have suitable means of egress and ingress;
4. That the said County Road is not necessary for public travel or convenience and that said County Road should be closed;
5. That due to the snow conditions in the winter and water conditions during the irrigation season, that the opening up of a Road between Lots 357 to 384 and Lots 356 to 385 of the said Rainbow Subdivision shall provide a better all-weather road than the Road petitioned herein to be closed.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, AND IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, that the said County Road described as follows:

Commencing at a point between the South line of Lots No. 340 and 264 of Rainbow Subdivision of Bozeman Hot Springs Tract, Gallatin County, Montana, as now on file and recorded in the Office of the County Clerk and Recorder of Gallatin County, Montana;

Thence running North between Lots No. 264, 263 and 262, to the South line of Lot No. 261, which lie on the West side of the road in question, and Lots No. 340, 341, 342, 343, 344, 345, 346, and that portion of Lot 347, which lie on the East side of said road, to a point on the West line of Lot No. 347, which is due East of the South line of Lot No. 261,

be discontinued as a public highway.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED AND DIRECTED, that the Acting County Surveyor of Gallatin County, Montana, record and plat in his office the closing of the above described County road as herein ordered, and that the lands formerly used and held as said County road which is hereby closed now revert to the adjoining land owners entitled thereto.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED AND DIRECTED, that a true and correct copy of this resolution be sent, by registered mail, to all of the petitioners who petitioned for closing of the above described road and to all land owners as disclosed by the last assessment rolls of the said Gallatin County, Montana, owning lands abutting on the roadway hereby closed, vacated, and discontinued.

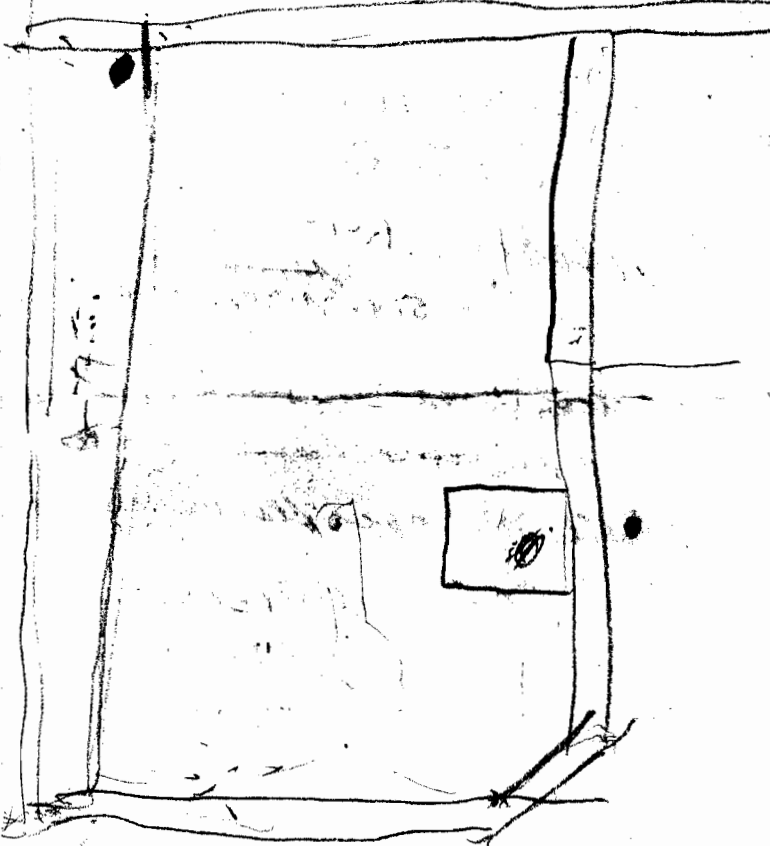
