Whereas the Board of County Commissioners of Gallatin County State of Montana, jointly with the Board of County Commissioners of Jefferson County, said state, have under consideration the advisability of constructing a public bridge across the Jefferson river at or about Section 35 Township One North Range One West Montana Meridian; and

Whereas said Commissioners of Gallatin County are of opinion and for the purchase of right of way and approaches to said bridge would not be fully justified in the present condition of the road and bridge funds of said Gallatin County; and

Whereas great and permanent benefit and convenience would result to the public at large and particularly to the undersigned from the early building of said bridge,

Now, therefore in consideration of the premises aforesaid, and as an inducement to the early construction of said bridge, we the undersigned hereby jointly and severally promise and agree, that if the said Commissioners will construct the bridge aforesaid, that we the undersigned will at our own proper expense proceed and convey to the said Gallatin County free of cost to it, all necessary right of way for convenient approach and access to said bridge and will in like manner construct the roadway and do all grading and earthwork necessary thereon and about and to the approaches of said bridge on the Gallatin County side or end thereof. All in accordance with the plans, specifications and requirements such as shall be made and given by the County ^{URV} Mayor of said County and all subject to the ratification and approval of said Commissioners, hereby further agreeing to do and complete the foregoing and all thereof by the time that said bridge may be completed and ready for use, without other or further notice than such as we may have or receive from the progress of work on said bridge and such proceedings and publications as may be had and made in and about the same.
